Sermon Summary for 11th February, 2018 "THE BIBLE AND OUR CIVIC RESPONSIBILITIES" Genesis 1: 1-4, 31; Matthew 17: 24-27; Philippians 3: 12-15

God created the world and at the end of His creation, He created man in his own image. God himself endorsed what He did by stating that, it is good (Genesis 1:31). Almighty God created a world that is good and wanted humankind to be responsible in keeping and living in it. To be responsible means, we should be accountable and answerable to God first and also to human authorities. Responsibility means we must care for the world and all that are in it.

To be responsible, we need to create good relationship among ourselves because good and corporate responsibility thrives on good human relationships. We have to be well disposed to our society. As citizens of the land on which we live, our responsibility includes being good stewards. We ought to be stewards of our own bodies and lives, human and natural resources, families, time, corporate culture of our organizations and workplaces. We also have to be stewards of the values norms and aspirations of our immediate and extended communities.

Prayer for local community, regional and national leaders should be seen as a major civic responsibility. Leadership is tough business. What makes leadership difficult is the premium put on leaders to deliver as agents of God. Leadership has the duty of allowing people to have their rights while remaining dutiful and responsible as true citizens. There is therefore the need to pray continuously for leaders within the community. Paul, in his apostolic letter to Timothy states explicitly that we should pray for those in authority. The call thus goes to us to keep praying for our leaders.

Payment of taxes is a primary duty of every citizen of a country and Christians are called upon to be at the forefront in the payment of their taxes. Mathew 17:24-27 and Romans 13:4-7 enjoins us to pay taxes. Jesus Christ himself paid taxes and thus endorsed tax payment. Evading tax is as sinful as committing fornication, adultery or stealing. Indeed, evading taxes is stealing.

One important civic responsibility often avoided and neglected is the individual effort of citizens to confront evil. There is systemic evil in every community. Systemic evil refer to vices in a community which have unknown originators. This means that the evil persists but no one is able to determine the source and originators of the evil. For example, no one is able to tell the person who introduced corruption into the system. All we know is that human beings can be corrupt. Since corruption has to do with evil, it must be resisted and confronted. Robert Linthicum, in his book Transforming Power, observed that no one rivals Jesus in confronting people and issues. He noted that Jesus confronted all manner of people including his own disciples. Even though difficult to do, we are called to confront evil from the biblical perspective.

As we celebrate Bible Sunday, we are called upon to remind ourselves that we have a Fe civic responsibility to be agents of change in our communities at all times. Fe (Rt. Rev. Dr. Setorwu K. Ofori) Fe
