Sermon Summary for 22nd April, 2018

"MISSING THE POINT OF DISCIPLESHIP"

(Mr. Edem Senanu) :

2 Kings 5: 19 - 27 and Mark 10: 35 - 40

As Christians we are absolutely privileged, because at no additional cost, our : heritage/inheritance in Christ includes training in a set of core beliefs and the development of a Godly value system that far supersedes any other type of value system.

This kind of training happens more effectively through intentional discipleship. which involves "a more mature Christian holding the hand of a less mature : one, and teaching as well as guiding him or her to understand and CON-STANTLY obey God's Word and to grow into maturity". Discipleship enables every Christian to have an increasingly intimate relationship with God. Such a relationship helps us to mature and to be in a position to make Godly decisions as we confront daily issues. This is the point of discipleship.

Unfortunately many people including Christians do not have a set of beliefs. principles or values like honesty and integrity etc., that they can describe as CORE, such that these beliefs or values are not ignored, changed or thrown out of the window, whenever there is a difficulty or crises.

Jesus spent 3 years or 36 months intentionally and systematically discipling 12 local men daily. He did this to do away with any pre-existing beliefs and : values that did not align with Godly values and to provide a new set of core beliefs, pulled together into a Godly value system, that ensured that every decision including the minute ones were taken based on their knowledge of God's word and a personal appreciation of what God expects his children to do.

Similarly, Prophet Elisha in the Old Testament sought to transfer core beliefs : 30 Apr: Mr. Ebenezer Terkutey and a Godly value system to his servant or attendant Gehazi over the course of several years. Unfortunately, the text in 2 Kings 5: 15 - 27 demonstrates that in spite of all Elisha's efforts, and all the time Gehazi spent around him, Gehazi missed the point of discipleship, he did not take advantage of his master, mentor or discipler's efforts and consequently did not build a personal relationship with God, to guide his choices and actions. Three (3) lessons amongst others are apparent from the text:

1. Familiarity and proximity, do not transfer core beliefs and a value system : nor produce intimacy with God. So we should not think that running around church, being part of various LIC activities or being around so-called men and women of God, will grow our relationship with God!

2. Our reality is warped or false when we have not built a personal relationship with God. Our priorities, focus, fears, efforts, including pursuing wealth, chasing opportunities, often cheating, lying, exploiting others, accepting bribes and favours emanate from not understanding that everything we need comes from a good relationship with God! He is our sufficiency, He is our provider, from Him flows everything.

3. Consequently, intimacy with God, or a deep & personal relationship with God, is the target; and discipleship facilitates this! Each of us should therefore commit and invest in developing a personal relationship with our Father, and helping others to do same. Focus on being and making disciples! Don't be a Gehazi and miss the point of discipleship!
