### Sermon Summary for 3rd June, 2018

### JESUS' JUDGEMENT ON 'RELIGION'

### Isaiah 1: 10-17; Mark 11: 12-19

(Mr. Julius Duah Coomson)

Mark 11:12-19 contains two stories that are difficult to associate with the Lord Jesus Christ. Both stories reveal Jesus' acts of judgement. Why did the Lord act the way He did in this text? Let's examine each of the stories and draw out some lessons for our own Christian walk.

### 1. Jesus' Judgement on a Fruitless Tree (vv12-14):

Jesus, on His way from Bethany to Jerusalem was hungry (v12). Seeing from a distance a fig tree in leaf, He went to look for something to eat. To His disappointment, He found "nothing but leaves" (v13). Jesus then an-: swered the fig tree with a curse (vv 14, 21) and it took effect (v21). Jesus' action might seem harsh but we need to understand two things. First, even though verse 13 notes that it was not yet the season for figs, we are told in : the same verse that the tree was in *leaf*. This is significant because fig trees in the Middle East start to produce some edible buds by March, which are followed by some few leaves in April. Then, by May, the edible buds will fall : and give way to real figs so that by June, when the leaves are fully out (the tree is in leaf), the figs would also be ready for eating. Jesus visited this tree in April (the Passover week) and even though it was not the season for figs, this tree 'promised' fruits by displaying full blown leaves. Jesus' judgement on the tree therefore was a judgement on hypocrisy; on promise without fulfilment. This is a symbolic act about God's people Israel. Throughout the : O.T. and parts of the N.T., Israel is depicted as God's fig tree (eg. Micah 7:1 -6, Jer. 7:9-11, 8:13, Luke 13:6-9). God was expecting fruit from them but they were only displaying leaves and Jesus was not pleased. We too as Christians are called to be fruitful (John 15:16, Gal. 5:22-23) and to heed Jesus' warning not to merely produce leaves, but more importantly, fruit. Just like the tree, many people in the church today have observable leaves (activities, names on membership lists of every ministry, religious talks, etc.) but no fruit (transformed character, making of converts, display of the fruit of the Spirit, and contributing to the growth of the church through dedicated service) to show. The Lord Jesus cautions us that fruitlessness in the Kingdom will be judged.

### 2. Jesus' Judgement on a Fruitless Temple (verses 15-19):

From the fig tree, Jesus went to the temple and there too, instead of finding the fruit of prayer and people lifting holy hands to God (v17), he found that the worship of God was being commercialized and that the temple had become a Den of robbers (a place where robbers hide after conducting their evil deeds). Even though the temple was busy, it was fruitless. Several people were in the temple to make profit, not to serve God in Spirit and in truth. In the words of Isaiah 1:10-17, the Israelites were trampling God's house (1:12). The condition of the temple has not changed in our days. Church has become a serious business ground and unfortunately, many people think God is pleased. On the contrary, Jesus' action teaches us that, no matter how busy the church becomes, it must not take away the essence of Christianity; which is to create the opportunity for people to encounter God. Jesus drove out what was not deserving of His house. Today, through the work of Christ on the cross we have become God's temple (1Cor. 3:16, 6:19). If the Lord Jesus should visit His temple today, are there things (attitudes, practices, sins or behaviour) He will cast out as He did in the temple? Let's surrender our lives to Him so that His Spirit can make us fruitful for His glory.


