Sermon Summary for 9th September, 2018

(Rev. Yaw Boamah)

### **"SACRIFICIAL GIVING"**

### 1 Chron. 29: 6-18: Mark 12: 41- 44

The subject of 'giving' is not a regular feature on our preaching calendar, which is sad. The familiar story of the poor widow's sacrificial giving in the Temple still has some useful lessons for us today.

Relationship: The people who came into the Temple did so because they had a relationship with the Lord. They were not tourists. They were worshippers and dropping money into the treasury box was not a meaningless act. It was part of the expression of their worship of the Living God. And so was this poor widow. She came as a worshipper and gave because of the relationship she knew she had with Jehovah. (Gen. 12:1&2) There was the giving of self before the giving of substance. (see Deut. 6:4-5; Exodus 25: 1,2) Here is the lesson: nobody gives money to secure a relationship with God. However, everyone who has the right relationship with God gives to promote God's work.

**Obedience:** Her giving was also an act of obedience. As a worshipper (Jew) her God had instructed her to do so. (2 Kings 12: 9-12)

Faith: The poor widow's giving showed that she relied on God for her upkeep not on her purse. "For the others put in what they had to spare of their riches; but she, poor as she is, put in all she had - she gave all she had to live on." (Mark 12:44 GNB; see also Proverbs 3:9&10)

She also gave freely without being compelled by anyone. God loves a cheerful giver (2 Cor. 9:7; see also 1 Chron. 29: 16-18) In fact, if there was somebody there directing how to give, she probably wouldn't have had the opportunity to give because what she had was very little.

She gave out of her Poverty (sacrificially). The point the Lord makes here is instructive: It is not the portion that is given but the proportion that is important! It is more about the quota (the percentage) than the quantum (the amount). Poverty should not be a barrier to giving to the Lord. (2 Cor. 8: 1&2)

In the end, her giving was noticed (even applauded) by the Lord who is allknowing. She was, unknown to her, commended by Jesus. Her giving caught the attention of the Lord and He shared it as a lesson point with the disciples.

Therefore, God is interested in how we give only if we already belong to Him, if we have a relationship with Him. If not, then our giving does not impress Him even though it may be sacrificial. On the other hand, if we have become beneficiaries of this amazing love then He expects us to give sacrificially to His cause. And how do we do that?

- ٠ It must be based on our relationship with Him: I belong to you, therefore, all I have also belongs to you.
- In obedience to His command
- Out of faith in His ability to provide for our every need.
- Freely, without compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.
- And assured that we have a God who sees and rewards accordingly.
