Sermon Summary for 7th October, 2018

"JESUS ESTABLISHES THE NEW COVENANT"

Exodus 12: 21 - 27; Mark 14: 12 - 26

(Dr. Frederick L. Phillips)

The covenant – a legal agreement – that God made with the house of Israel begun with the killing of the Passover lamb and the marking of the top and sides of the doorframes of their houses with the blood of the lamb. God prevented the destroyer from entering the houses thus marked, so the Israelites escaped the death plague, while the rest of the land lost their first-borns, both of animals and men. Brought out of slavery in Egypt, the people of Israel met the living God at Mount Sinai, where they agreed to obey the laws and regulations he gave to them through Moses. However, they failed to keep these laws, and they were rejected by God.

In taking a portion of the meal he and his disciples were sharing on the very occasion of the Passover Festival, and declaring "Take it; this is my body broken for you", and "this cup is the new covenant in my blood which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins", Jesus was stating, in effect, that he was the one who fulfills the prophecy recorded in Jeremiah 31:31-34: "The time is coming, declares the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their forefathers when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant....This is the covenant I will make ... I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people...because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD. For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

Therefore in celebrating the Lord's Supper, we are reminding ourselves that we have been saved from death, delivered from slavery to sin, and willing to serve the living God. What the law could not do, Christ has done for us – ours is not conformity to an external code; it is yieldedness to an internal motivation from the indwelling Holy Spirit. So we have no excuse! ("For sin shall not be your master..." Rom.6:14). If we live carelessly, then we are failing to keep our side of the legal contract. And Paul warns that anyone eating the bread and drinking the cup without recognizing that it is a sharing in the broken body of the Christ, eats and drinks judgment on himself/herself.

Are you keeping your side of the new covenant, to obey and serve the Lord in righteousness? Evaluate yourself against Colossians 3: 5 – 9; 12 & 13:

"You must put to death, then, the earthly desires at work in you, such as sexual immorality, indecency, lust, evil passions, and greed (for greed is a form of idolatry). Because of such things God's anger will come upon those who do not obey him. At one time you yourselves used to live according to such desires, when your life was dominated by them. But now you must get rid of all these things: anger, passion, and hateful feelings. No insults or obscene talk must ever come from your lips. Do not lie to one another, for you have put off the old self with its habits. You are the people of God; he loved you and chose you for his own. So then, you must clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Be tolerant with one another and forgive one another whenever any of you has a complaint against someone else. You must forgive one another just as the Lord has forgiven you."

- Pray for all LIC members and the Church in Ghana: that everyone of us will come to know what God has called us to do and be focused in accomplishing it (1 Corinthians 15:58; Ephesians 2:10)
- Pray for all those living in Ghana: that the Spirit of God will teach us to be responsible citizens and play our part in nation building. Pray that Christians in Ghana will not make excuses but be the example for others to follow (Romans 13:1-7; Jeremiah 29:7; James 4:17)
