Sermon Summary for 11th November, 2018

"NOT GUILTY BUT CONDEMNED"

1 Kings 21: 1-16; Mark 15: 1-15

Trials under Jewish law had to adhere to strict observance of the Hebrew Criminal Code but rules such as no trials during the Passover or during the night or on the eve of the Sabbath were ignored by the Sanhedrin. Additionally, the Sanhedrin was without authority to instigate charges and was only supposed to investigate charges brought before it, yet in the case of Christ, the court itself formulated the charges. Caiaphas, the High Priest presented the charge, and he was one of the judges.

It is also important to note that no accusation of blasphemy was made to Pilate; had such been presented, the governor, thoroughly pagan in heart and mind, would probably have dismissed the charge as utterly unworthy of a hearing; which is why the accusing Sanhedrists did not hesitate to substitute the charge of blasphemy they had convicted Jesus with, with the charge of high treason (Jesus claimed to be a king, thus making him guilty of rebellion against Rome).

Friends in Christ, whenever we come in contact with Jesus Christ, no matter how inadvertent that contact is, whether we realize it or not at the time, we are faced with the most important decision of our life. If we decides to investigate further and eventually to open our life to Jesus Christ, our life and eternal destiny head in one direction. If we ignore what we have heard, or we ridicule or reject it, our life and eternal destiny go in another opposite direction. To do nothing or to put off a decision is to decide. Neutrality is impossible where Jesus is concerned!

The main reason why people knowingly, willingly reject Jesus Christ is that they do not want to give up their sin. They resent Jesus confronting their comfortable way of life. They like running their own lives and they do not want to yield to Jesus as Lord. And so, like these religious leaders, they are vehement in their hatred toward Jesus as Lord and Christ. They will do anything to get Him out of their lives. They will even invent and believe in lies.

Today, dear friend, if you were to be tried alongside of Jesus, would there be enough evidence to return a verdict of guilty? Or would there be insufficient evidence to convict you? If someone critically examined your life – where you went – what you said – what you did, would they find any spiritual fruit – hard evidence to prove that you are a true follower of Jesus?
