# Sermon Summary for 28th October, 2018 "JESUS THE KING IS ARRESTED AND TRIED"

2 Samuel 16: 5-13: Mark 14: 43-65

(Rev. Julius D. Coomson)

Right from Mark 11, we see the details of the final week leading up to Jesus' death. Today's passage reveals the events of the Thursday evening leading into early Friday morning. There are three main things the text shows us:

# 1. Jesus is deserted because of Gain (vv43-46)

After Jesus' time of prayer in Gethsemane, Judas, one of the twelve apostles arrived with a crowd from the Sanhedrin (v43). The Sanhedrin was made up of the chief priests, teachers of the law and the elders. We have already encountered this group in Mark 8:31, 11:27-28 and 14:1. In all these instances, we observe their hatred for Jesus. The crowd was armed and had come to arrest Jesus, However, they needed someone to lead them to Jesus, Judas made: himself available for that role. Why would someone who walked with Jesus and ate from the same bowl with Jesus betray Him? From Mark 14:10-11, we learn that Judas did this for gain. The specific amount he was promised was 30: pieces of silver (Matt 26:14-16); the value for a slave (Exodus 21:32). Judas had walked with Jesus for 3 years and yet for personal gain, he traded the relationship he had with Jesus. We often dissociate ourselves from Judas' story and yet, we all stand the temptation of deserting Jesus for gain; the gain of an office promotion, money, a new relationship, a new job, power, pleasure, etc. In what ways are you tempted to behave like Judas or in what ways are vou living as a Judas?

# 2. Jesus is deserted because of Pain (47-52)

Unlike Judas, the other disciples were determined not to trade Jesus at any cost. In John 18:10, we see Simon Peter striking the ear of the high priest's servant and Jesus promptly rebuked him because He didn't condone violence. Clearly the disciples were willing to stand with Jesus but when Jesus declared that scripture must be fulfilled, they all deserted Him (vv49, 50). They were willing to stand for Jesus, as long as it wasn't going to bring them pain or challenges. How would you have fared if you were there with Jesus? We too face the temptation of abandoning our devotion to Jesus when the pressure is high. For example, we sometimes slow down in our devotion to Jesus when work or study pressure gets high. We sometimes turn our backs on Jesus, when standing for Him will put our relationships or jobs at stake. What challenge are you facing that is making you desert your allegiance to Jesus? Look to Jesus (Heb.)

# 3. Jesus suffered Injustice to Justify Sinful Humanity (53-65)

When Jesus was arrested. He was sent before the Sanhedrin to stand trial. A very careful look at Jesus' trial shows that everything that took place at His trial portrayed injustice. First, in vs 53, we see that the very people who sought to kill Jesus (in vs 1) were to judge Him. Second, in vs 55, they had already determined Jesus must die but were only looking for evidence to execute Him. Third, in vs 56, we read that the charges that were brought against Jesus were false, contrary to Exodus 20:16. Furthermore, their testimonies didn't agree and according to Deut. 19:15, that should have been enough reason to set Jesus free. However, the Sanhedrin kept on fishing for evidence to kill Jesus. When all efforts to find Jesus guilty failed, the High Priest confronted Jesus directly regarding His Identity. When Jesus declared that He was the Messiah, He was condemned to die (v64). Throughout this unjust trial, it is interesting that Jesus kept silent and thus fulfilled Isaiah 53.7. He did not defend Himself so that He could be our advocate before Gods throne (1 John 2:1). Jesus was condemned to die (v64) so that those who believe in Him will not be condemned (Rom. 8:1). The Blameless was blamed so that we, the blame-worthy, could go free. The guiltless was killed so that guilty humanity could be justified. This is the Christian Gospel and we have only two responses to the gospel: to accept what Jesus did on the cross for us or to reject His finished work. Whatever our choice, we shouldn't forget that Jesus suffered, not for His own sins but for our sins.
